

This thesis focuses on the United States objection to the exemption granted by the Kyoto Protocol to China. The treaty includes the United States but excludes China on the obligation of limiting the energy using to stabilize the atmosphere from the greenhouse gasses. The United States accuses China as the second largest emitter in the world that should also be responsible in stabilizing the atmosphere. On the other hand, China considers that its emission level is still considerably acceptable since it is now developing its economy. The Kyoto Protocol is actually a legal instrument of the Climate Change Convention that has been ratified by the United States but it inconsistently withdraws from the protocol.
