## **Abstract**

This study explores the driving factors with determine the failure of the local Regulation Number 5 of 2007 concerning Prohibition of Prostitution in Bantul Regency. The purpose of this study is to explain the evaluation of the Local Regulation Number 5 of 2007 regarding the prohibition of prostitution in Bantul Regency and to find out what are the driving factors that influence the failure of the Perda. Methodologically, this study used a qualitative research under a case study approach. To collect data, this study used two techniques, namely documentation study and in-depth interviews. To measure the evaluation of this Perda, this study uses six indicators, namely effectiveness, efficiency, adequacy, responsiveness, equality and appropriateness. The findings of this study are that from the six indicators, three indicators are categorized as less successful, and the other three indicators are successful. The factors that influence the success and failure of this Perda are effectiveness, adequacy and responsiveness. Thus, it can be concluded that the evaluation of this Perda has not been maximally successful, but it still necessarily makes a number of serious efforts to increase supervision of the implementation of the Perda.
