### **ABSTRACTION**

This undergraduate thesis tried to discuss about Women's Political Participation in the Legislative Seats in Malaysia. Since the Declaration of Human right was published in the world, men and women have equal position in many sectors of life. However, based on the data of Malaysia's election results during 1955-2008, there was no significant increase in women's representatives in the legislative seats in Malaysia. Based on the theory used, women's political representation in the legislative seats in Malaysia is low because of some institutional obstacle such as systemic institutions obstacle, practical institutions obstacle and normative institutions obstacle.
