#### **ABSTRACT**

This thesis sought to find out the reasons that led the United States' administration to restore military relations with Indonesia after the revocation of its military embargo toward Indonesia. The research used foreign policy concept, decision making theory, and system theory as theoretical framework of the research. The research started from the hypothesis which argues that the reasons of the United States' administration to restore military relations with Indonesia was to more effectively combat the rise of international terrorist network in Indonesia. The method used in this thesis is qualitative method in form of literature studies from books, journals, and media. After thorough research, the writer found that the reason of the U.S. administration to restore military relations with Indonesia is rooted in the existence of Jama'ah Islamiyyah which threatens the existence its citizens and interests in Indonesia, yet the U.S. could not interfere directly toward the case of terrorist attacks in Indonesia. Therefore, the U.S. administration needs a bilateral cooperation with Indonesia in term of Military relations in order to protect its citizens and interests from the possibility of terrorist attacks.
