Abstract

Regarding the development of Information and Communication Technology (ICT), various concepts have been developed to replace the traditional learning methods, and one of them is the concept of E-learning. Besides, E-learning can be used as an alternative for problems in the field of education which comes as an additional complement or substitute for existed learning activities. The purpose of this study is to discover students' perception on their Elearning activity. This research focused on two main objectives, that is; students' perception on the benefits of E-learning activity and the challenges that the students faced in E-learning activity. This research was conducted at English Language Education Department (ELED) of a private university in Yogyakarta. The descriptive qualitative design was used as a research method of this study. The research data was collected through the interview. The participants who were involved in this study were four students of batch 2016 that have taken at least 7 subjects that applied E-learning. This study revealed that E-learning activity gave four main perceptions on the benefit of E-learning activity, in that E-learning activity can motivate students in learning, offers flexibility, avoids boredom, and minimize cost. Additionally, this study also indicated that there are six challenges that students faced in doing E-learning activity, namely; lack of digital literacy, technical issues, unclear instructions, low face to face interaction, delayed and unclear feedbacks, and possiblity of cheating and plagiarizing.
